EHP Program Overview

- Ensures all Federal Agency actions are compliant with Federal EHP Laws and Executive Orders.
- Integrates protection and enhancement of the environmental, historic, and cultural resources into FEMA's mission.
- Applies to all FEMA programs and activities.

LAWS AND EO'S INCLUDE:

- Endangered Species Act (ESA)
- Migratory Bird Treaty Act (MBTA)
- Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act
- Clean Water Act (CWA)
- National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA)

- EO 11990, Wetlands
- Clean Air Act (CAA)
- Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA)
- Coastal Zone Management Act (CZMA)



NHPA Overview – General Section 106

- Determine and document Area of Potential Effect (APE)
- Review existing information on known and potential historic properties
- Seek information from others who may have additional information
- Identify Historic Properties
- Evaluate Historic Significance
- Apply National Register Criteria
- Make Determination of Effect/Eligibility
- Initiate consultation, dependent on determination.



Consultation SHPO/THPO/TDR

- What is the difference?
 - SHPO State Historic Preservation Officer
 - THPO Tribal Historic Preservation Officer
 - TDR Tribally Designated Representative

- Who do we consult with?
 - State/Public/Private Land SHPO and THPO/TDR with Areas of Interest.
 - Tribal Land THPO or SHPO/TDR in the event a THPO is not in place.

- PA 406 Mitigation
- Demolitions
- Expanded footprints
- Relocations or new construction
- HMA Construction Projects
