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MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING: MOU'S WITH CALIFORNIA NATIVE AMERICAN TRIBES

PURPOSE OF MOU PROGRAM

 The purpose of the MOU program is to establish and formalize a consultation relationship between California Native American Tribes and State Parks to address, in a systematic manner, park management actions that may impact cultural and natural resources of concern or interest to the California Native American Tribes in Parks Districts, Units, and Programs.

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GATHERING POLICY WITHIN STATE PARKS

TRIBAL AFFAIRS PROGRAM AND NATURAL RESOURCES PROGRAM

- Gathering within different Parks Districts occur with an understanding between interested Tribes and District leadership
- Tribal Affairs Program can help facilitate discussions with Districts you are interested in creating a MOU or Gathering Agreement with.
- Tribal Affairs Program is currently reviewing past work on the Gathering Policy to facilitation creation of a Statewide policy.



NAGPRA PROGRAM: CALIFORNIA STATE PARKS

TRIBAL AFFAIRS PROGRAM AND NAGPRA

- NAGPRA Program is housed within the Tribal Affairs Program: Cultural Resources
 Division and is separate from the California Indian Heritage Center (CIHC) Collections
- Oversee the Federal NAGPRA compliance, CalNAGPRA compliance (once in place), and collection care.

TRIBAL JUSTICE PROJECT | UC DAVIS SCHOOL OF LAW

- Work toward drafting policies and procedures that comply with both federal NAGPRA and CalNAGPRA
- Amendments to CalNAGPRA through AB 275 (Ramos)
